Dr. Watley is a native of St. Louis, Missouri and was educated in the St. Louis public schools. He received an A.B. degree from St. Louis University, the M.Div. degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center of Atlanta, Ga. the M Phil, degree from Columbia University of New York City, and is currently a Ph.D. candidate at Columbia and Union Theological Seminary, a joint program in New York City in the Field of Social Ethics. He received the Honorary LLD degree from Edward Waters College in 1977

Dr. Watley served as pastor of Union A.M.E. Church of Warwick, N. Y. from 1972-74. He served as pastor of Macedonia A.M.E. Church of Flushing, N. Y. from 1974-78 and is currently serving as President of Paul Quinn College of Waco, Texas.

He is a recipient of the Rockefeller Doctoral Fellowship and also serves as a member of the Final Selection Committee for Awards for North American Blacks in Religion (The Fund for Theological Education), a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, the Rotary Club, Lions Club International, and the Governing Board of the National Council of Churches.

In 1974, Dr. Watley appeared in the Awards Volume of OUtstanding Young Men in America.
