One Cause Of Teenage Pregnancy

NEW YORK, NY - Why are school boards throughout the country considering sex education .id family life programs? Here are some of the reasons:

Each year more than one million teenagers become pregnant.

Seventy percent of pregnant teenagers do not finish school.

More than a quartermillion cases of VD among teenagers are reported annually. One of every five 13-

and 14-year-olds has already had sexual intercourse; more than half of all teenagers are sexually active before age 20.

"Schools need parents as partners if the sex or family life education program is to succeed," Gordon and Dickman stress. "Even to begin such a program, the schools need parents' support." They outline many ways parents and schools can work together.


