organized political struggle.

He said there are "many mad colonialists in Africa" and some that try to "dominate Africa from abroad." Africans and African-Americans, he said, have a common enemy who "uses our color as a reason to oppress us." He drew loud applause when he said now is the "moment for us to unite and demonstrate our oneness in victory. . . for black can be more dominant than white." He added that by fighting racialism, "we did not transpose ourselves as

racist."

He called the reception a "reunion of people with a single bond binding them toward common objectives, celebrating the independence of Zimbabwe upon the completion of their studies. . . we will need your skills and participation." Then, with a phrase that brought cheers, "come home, therefore."

Amid cries of "Long live Zimbabwe" and "Mugabe, Mugabe," the Prime Minister concluded saying how touched he had been by the "very warm, exceptionally warm reception." He added that

he was full of conviction and belief that in African-Americans, Zimbabwe has "not only true friends and allies, but intimate brothers and sisters. . . Let us forge on in unity as we have in the past."

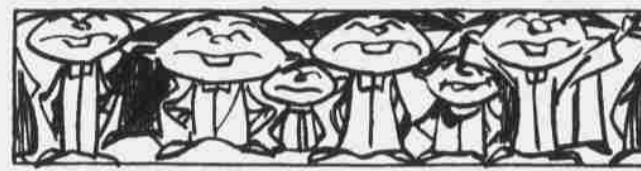
