**TIPS ON TRIPS**

Planning a trip is more than deciding when to go and what to see. Protecting your home and property while on vacation is important too.  
Besides notifying police, friends and neighbors when you'll be away, stop all regular deliveries such as newspapers. Also arrange to have the post office hold your mail.



The editors of Mobil Travel Guide suggest other precautions:  
\*Install automatic switches so different lights go on at different times. Don't just turn on one light to "fool" burglars.

**HOW TO SELECT CARPETS**

When you start out to buy carpets, you can get more for your money if you decide exactly what kind of carpet you need before you leave home.



**Bouncy sponge rubber padding can add richness to even low-pile carpets.**

First, determine how much wear and tear the carpet will have to take. Heavy traffic areas require sturdy carpets, but in light traffic areas, you needn't be so careful. In a busy thoroughway, for example, install a densely constructed carpet—either a tight saxony or cut and loop texture. You need top quality where you get top wear.

A practical choice for a lived-in living room that can be pretty, too, is one of the new, soft multicolored or tone-on-tone carpets, say carpet experts at Bigelow. An inferior carpet can mat and scuff under heavy traffic.

Although every fiber can fulfill certain needs, it's not a good idea to go shopping mainly for fiber. Look first for style, color and construction. Then consider the fiber. Remember that even nylon won't give you good service if the carpet is badly constructed.

One new carpet fiber, ANSO IV, has built-in soil and stain resistance. Check the label.

**18,000 GM Employees Will Be Recalled From Layoff**

— An estimated 18,700 General Motors employees will be recalled from indefinite layoff beginning in October to meet anticipated increased demands for 1981 passenger cars and light duty trucks.  
F.J. McDonald, executive vice president in charge of North American car and truck operations, said the return to work results from resumption of second shift operations or line rate adjustments at two passenger car and three truck assembly plants, and is based on the improved trend in the sales rate since May.  
"There is growing evidence of strength in the market," McDonald said, "signalled by such indicators as improving consumer confidence and higher used car prices, which normally portend higher new car sales."  
"These production increases will provide improved availability of regular and mid-size

passenger cars and light duty trucks in anticipation of GM's 1981-model demand. We are confident that this improved outlook will be matched with renewed stability in the economy and a continued rise in consumer confidence."  
Mr. McDonald said the increases in assembly production will also require the recall of employees to GM component plants and facilities.  
The effective dates of the production schedule increases and assemble employees affected are:  
\*Chevrolet Motor Division, Flint, resumption of second shift on light duty trucks, October 27, and Suburban, Blazer and Jimmy models, November 3, with 3,500 employees being recalled.  
\*GM Assembly Division, Baltimore, Md., increase in light duty truck production effective, October 6, resulting in 225 employees being recalled. The plant produces

Chevrolet and GMC light duty trucks along with mid-size Chevrolet Monte Carlo, Malibu and Pontiac LeMans passenger cars.  
\*GM Assembly Division, Leeds, Mo., resumption of second shift, October 20, with 2,000 employees being recalled. The plant produces Chevrolet Monte Carlo, Malibu and Buick Regal models.  
\*Component plants will recall and estimate 10,000 employees from indefinite layoff to support these production increases.  
In addition to the U.S. production increases, McDonald said GM of Canada will increase the line rate on van production at Scarborough, Ontario, and regular-size Chevrolet and Pontiac models at Oshawa, Ontario. These increases, along with component related recalls, will result in 1,050 employees returning to work from indefinite layoff in Canada.
