CHURCH WORLD SERVICE ACTIVE

IN REFUGEE RELIEF IN SOMALIA Church World Service, the 33 year old relief and development agency of 32 U.S. Protestant denominations, has joined with two other relief agencies to launch an emergency aid program to deal with the massive influx of refugees into drought-ridden Somalia in the Horn of East Africa.

According to the United Nations, there are now 1.5 million refugees in the African nation, some 25 per cent of its total population. Somalia is one of the 25 poorest countries of the world as measured by its per capita GNP (\$130). The refugees are fleeing from the war-torn Ogaden desert region of Ethiopia.

Paul Hartling, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, has called the Somali refugee problem the 'worst in the world." It is also one of the least known in the U.S.

Joining with Church World Service in the new relief consortium called the Inter-Church Response to the Horn of Africa are Catholic Relief Services and Lutheran World Relief. It will help both the refugees and other Somalians affected by the region's severe
