**Celebrates 88th Anniversary**

 West Durham Baptist Church, at a duly called and assembled business meeting held at the Church at 5:30 o'clock p.m., August 25, 1968, authorized the officers and Trustees of the church to convey all of the real property belonging to the Church and located at 1001 Thaxton Avenue, for a sum of \$125,750.00. Earl E. Artis, Alfornce Stewart, William P. Kearney, Eugene A. Harrington, Oather Jones, John Plummer, Sr., John Plummer, Sr., Palmer Perkins, Jr., Lee E. Jones, Matther J. Brown, William E. Fuller, Malachi Duke, S.L. Johnson, John Roberson, P.L. Perkins, Sr., Alonzo Hill and W.L. McAuley, being Trustees of the church, were persons to convey its real property.

On April 13, 1969, the Groundbreaking ceremony took place for the present church structure. Sunday, April 19, 1970 at 10 a.m., marked the last gathering at the church located on Thaxton Avenue. A motorcade formed and the congregation traveled to the new

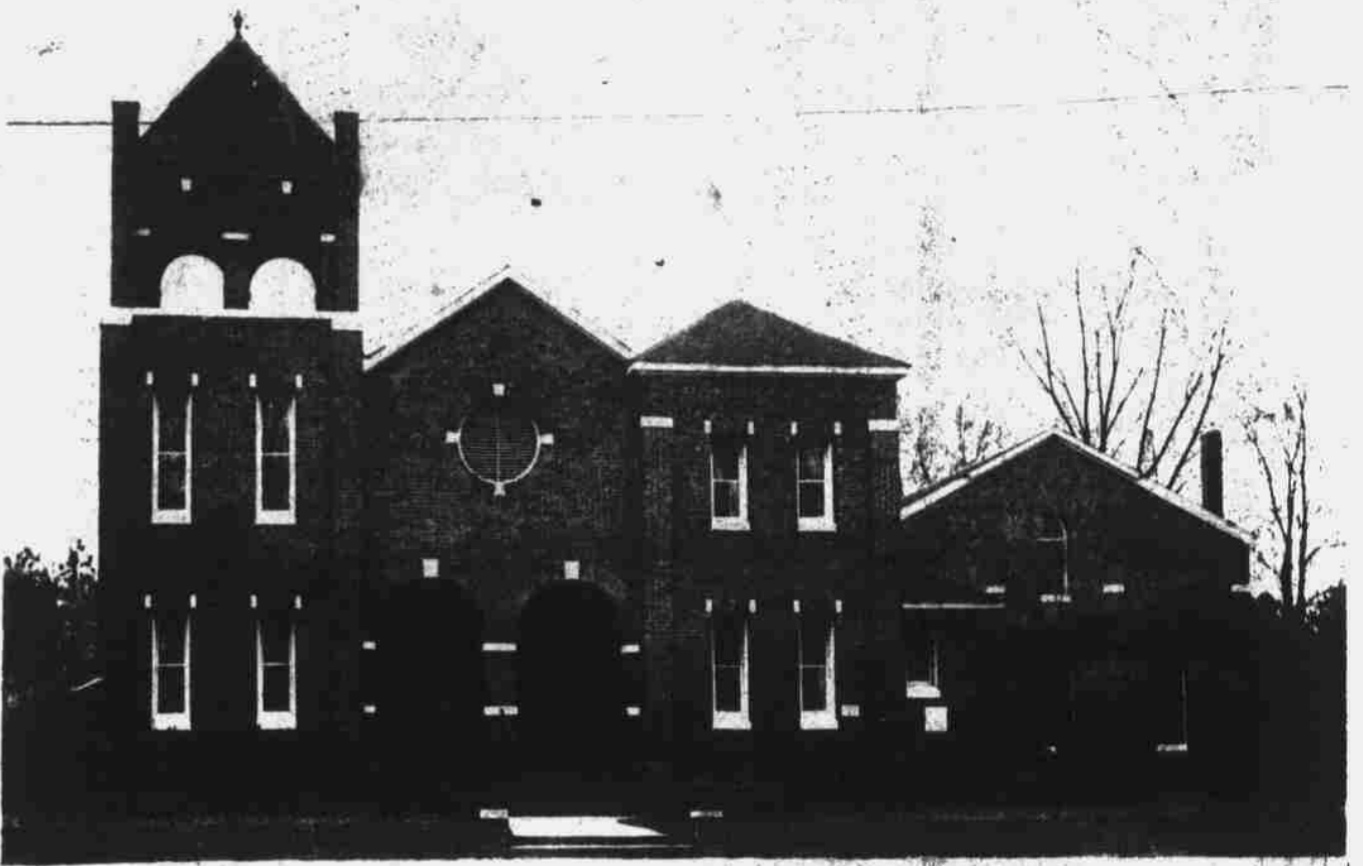
church which was the third new building in the history of the West Durham Baptist Church.

The church is no longer located in the Western section of the city. The new facility is valued at a quarter of a million dollars.

On April 18, 1871, formal dedication took place.

Dr. Charles E. Cobb, executive director, United Church of Christ, Commission for Racial Justice, was the speaker for the occasion. Dr. Cobb, a Durham native, spent much of his childhood be-

ing affiliated with the Church Sunday School and other young people's organizations. Other participants were: The Reverend J.C. Herrin, American Baptist Convent-
