Negotiations with the State Highway Commission having been completed short of a request to the Bureau of Roads in Washington to investigate the planning of that section of the Expressway which would run in front of the church building on Thaxton Avenue and, that pending that investigation, no Federal funds be released for the Durham project, the events moved forward. Additional property was purchased on Athens and Nixon Streets. Plans to build a parsonage were abandoned and with the additional property purchased, the land holdings increased to four acres - the site on which the church now stands.






