



Vikings Surrender to NCCU Eagles

Big Birds Perched Atop CIAA Poll

The homestanding North Carolina Central Eagles flexed their muscles as they bullied an oversized Elizabeth City State team 28-14 at O'Kelly Stadium. In doing so, the Eagles assured themselves of at least a tie for the CIAA crown with a 6-0 conference mark.

Senior quarterback Charles Yuille, the NAIA District 26 Offensive Player of the Week for his play against the Vikings, completed 14 of 20 passes for 170 yards and 3 touchdowns. He put the Eagles out front with 12:27 left in the initial period with a 28 yard scoring toss to sophomore split end Victor Hunter.

The Vikings came back and scored with 3:44 on a 7 yard run by Gary Sneed but missed the extra point, thus the Eagles led 7-6.

Yuille connected with Hunter on another 28 yard scoring play at the 6:58 mark and Central led 14-6 at halftime.

The Eagles went over the goal twice in the third period. First on a 6 yard Kenny Pugh to Victor Hunter pass play and second on a Yuille to Carl Sanders pass play for 14 yards.

The Vikings scored a safety when Bennie Tate

was tackled in the end zone. Sneed capped the scoring with a 1 yard run with 1:48 left in the game. Hunter, caught 7 passes for 90 yards and 3 tds. He now has scored 9 touchdowns this year.

The day belonged to the diminutive Carl Sanders. Sanders, a 5-5 149 wide receiver from Wilson, had 96 career receptions before the game. He had 6 catches for 56 yards thus becoming the all-time NCCU pass receiver with 102 career receptions. He broke the mark of 101 held by Julian Martin from 1966-69.

Yuille led all rushers with 46 yards in 10 carries, thus giving him 216 yards in total offense for the

game. The Eagles amassed 336 yards in total offense; 186 through the airways.

The Eagles held the Vikings to only 54 yards in 38 carries. Gary Sneed, the fourth leading rusher in the conference, was held to 33 yards in 22 carries.

NCCU's Michael Worthing was only able to muster 36 yards in 15 attempts on the wet turf.

MEAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference office of the Commissioner has announced that Howard University's quarterback Ronald Wilson is the MEAC Offensive Player of the Week, Miles McChriston, a Bethune-Cookman guard, is this week's top offensive lineman, and tackle John

Alford of South Carolina State is the Defensive Player of the Week.

Wilson, a 6-1, 180-pound senior from Washington, D.C.; completed thirteen of nineteen passes for 233 yards and one touchdown in Howard's Conference win over N.C. A&T. The game was played in a steady

rain. McChriston was superb in the trenches as Bethune-Cookman defeated Tuskegee Institute 22-13 Saturday. All three Wildcat touchdowns were scored over his blocks, and he graded 92 per cent on the game film. The 6-2, 240-pound senior captain is from Jacksonville, Florida.

In S.C. State's victory over MEAC foe Florida A&M, Alford was outstanding, as he recorded eleven unassisted tackles including two quarterback sacks. The 6-2, 270-pound senior from Dillion, S.C. also added four assisted tackles.
