

**"THE MARSH—**

**A Quiet Mystery" To Be Shown and Narrated**

Our vanishing wetlands and the abundant wildlife they harbor will be examined in the second film of the 1980-81 Audobon Wildlife Film Series.

"The Marsh—A Quiet Mystery," will be shown and narrated by its naturalist-producer, Thomas A Sterling at 8 pm on Thursday,

December 11 in the Phillips Junior High School auditorium on Estes Dr. Tickets will be available at the door at \$2.50 for adults

and \$1.25 for youths through senior high school age. With scenes such as two male bullfrogs wrestling and a family of river otters wander-

ing, Sterling captures vignettes of life in the marshlands of Michigan, Utah, Oregon, and Ontario, Canada.

Concern over the depletion of our wetlands led Sterling to produce the film for the public. Once, there were 127 million acres of interior and coastal wetlands in the United States. Little more than fifty percent of these lands are left now, according to the National Audobon Society. Loss of the wetlands has resulted in lower water tables, increased flooding, stream siltation, loss of wildlife and diminished wildlife populations—a substantial toll.

The two remaining films of the four-film series are Walter Berlet's "American Heartland: The Great River Story" to be shown Wednesday, January 28, and Norm Wakeman's "Inside Passage To Alaska" to be shown Tuesday, April 7.

This year marks the sixth season of the film series, which is sponsored by the New Hope Audobon Society, the Animal Protection Society and the National Audobon Society.

**ENTERTAINMENT COMPANY STOCKS**

Question: I want to invest in broadcast and entertainment stocks. What do you recommend I look for?



Some investors are tuning into investments in the broadcast and entertainment industries.

Answer: Broadcast and entertainment stocks are a good investment in a recession. Broadcasters have anticipated a slowing economy for over a year. They respect what a revenue slowdown could do to profits. For example, most station group operators cut spending on expensive programming last year.

Here are guidelines to consider, suggested by experts at the investment firm of Bache Halsey Stuart Shields. With networks, the effect of competition on revenues is important. So check broadcast ratings carefully. Station groups are generally more diversified. Their non-broadcast divisions have more of an impact on earnings, so pay close attention to overall performance.
