Bishop Says: Blacks Are Flocking Back To Church

A conservative Republican President whose fiscal and economic policies are creating chaos in poor and black communities is forcing black people back into the pews of the nation's black churches. That is the analysis of the leadership of the United Holy Church of America, Inc., which is having its 13th annual convocation in Durham this week. According to Bishop Jesse Jones, president of the 3,000-member organization consisting of about fifty churches in western North Carolina, "we are seeing a return to the black church and it is directly related to the economic policies of this nation. People are suffering in more ways than one and they are returning to their spiritual roots." Bishop Elroy Lewis, an official of the convocation and pastor of Fisher's Memorial United Holy Church in Durham, said, "the black church is the only institution that black people own." "The black church is owned by black people," Lewis said, "and you cannot say that about the courthouse or the public schools. It serves as a launching pad for everything that is positive in the black community." While many churches are losing their youth enrollments, the United Holy Church is not facing that dilemma. "We have a strong youth contingent in our church," Bishop Jones said. "Our services are filled with young people. We address issues that they are concerned with such as jobs and education." The week long convocation that began last Sunday and ends this Sunday, features sermons, hymn singing, prayer sessions and speeches from Durham political figures such as H.M. "Mickey" Michaux and District Court Judge Karen Galloway. "We are very much involved in issues," said Elijah Williams, another church spokesman, "politics has always been at the heart of the church." Williams said that groups such as the Moral Majority, a Virginia-based conservative organization are "using" religion to keep blacks "oppressed." Lewis said that his church, like many others in their organization, kept a registry that allowed them to see which of their members were registered voters and which were not. "We are constantly registering people," he said. "More specifically, the black church pro-

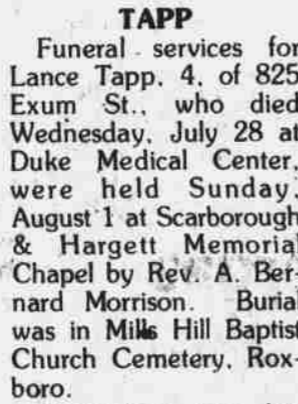

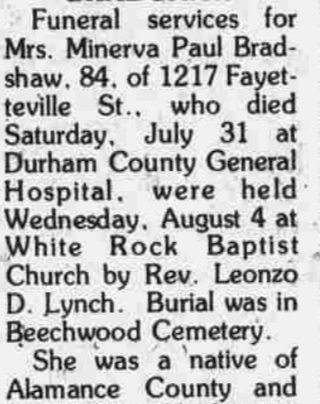
