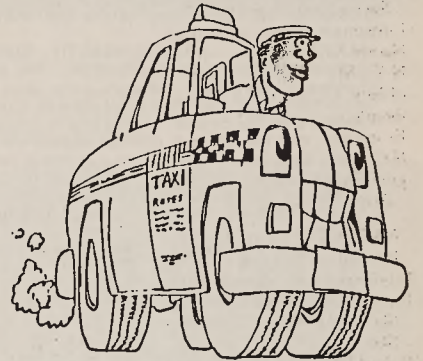
Fat contributes more to weight problems than does sugar. Forty percent of the average American's calories come from fat; 20 percent come from sugar.

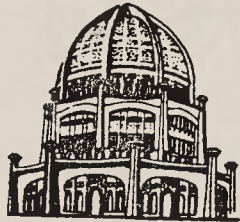
