Lilcoln Nursing Alumni Hold Reunion

In 2013, Lincoln Hospital School of Nursing held its Twenty-Second Biennial Reunion at the Millennium Hotel, Durham, North Carolina. Over 35 graduates of the school of nursing, along with family and friends gathered over the week-end to attend a Luncheon that captured the Theme: A Historical Vision.

Dr. Evelyn B. Wicker, class of 1963 was the keynote speaker. Dr. Wicker spoke of her journey to complete the very first history of the school of nursing. Titled, "Voices: History of Lincoln Hospital School of Nursing". This historical book captures the stories and lives of many of the 614 nurses who graduated from the school. With the school closing in 1971, many graduates continue to excel in their profession and gives back to the community. Additionally, the book chronicles the history of the school along with many administrators, instructors and city officials that made the school viable from 1903 through 1971. A book signing by the author immediately followed the Luncheon.

During the luncheon, the Alumni Association presented the North Carolina Central University Foundation a check in the Amount of Seventy Five hundred dollars (\$7500). Chancellor, Dr. Debra Saunders-White accepted the check on behalf of the University. The funds will be added to the Alumni's Endowed Scholarship Fund which supports and provides scholarships to deserving nursing students.

Some of the week-end activities included a tour of the city as well as a tour of the "state of the art" Eagle General Hospital. This high-tech learning center is a part of the North Carolina Central Department of Nursing. This was a highlight for many of the graduates to see the technological advancements to learning that the present enrolled nursing students have at their disposable.
