SAVANNAH, Ga. - The North Carolina Central University women's basketball team suffered a 60-53 road loss as the Lady Eagles (9-16, 4-8 MEAC) gave up 33 turnovers resulting in 28 Savannah State Lady Tiger (15-11, 8-4) points on Monday, Feb. 17 in Savannah, Ga.

Redshirt senior Jessica Freeman (Charlotte) led all-scorers finishing the game with 20 points on 8-for-22 shooting from the field, 2-for-10 from behind the arc and 2-for-2 from the charity stripe while also collecting three rebounds and three

The contest remained scoreless until the 17:38 when SSU's Kenyata Hendrix broke the scoring drought putting her Lady Tigers on top 2-0.

SSU scored five unanswered points before Freeman put NCCU on the board for the first time with 15:39 left on the first half clock.

The Lady Tigers pulled ahead by as many as 10 points with nearly ten minutes left in the first frame before the Lady Eagles raffied on a 14-4 run, tying the contest for the first time at 21 after Freeman connected with rookie Morgan Jones (Stockbridge, Ga.) from three-point range at the four minute mark.

With 56 seconds left in first half action Freeman's jumper in the paint gave NCCU its first lead of the game before SSU closed out the half on a 4-0 run, taking the two-point, 27-25 lead into the half.

Freeman opened up the second frame nailing a shot from behind the are giving the Lady Eagles their only lead of the half.

After switching baskets for the first ten minutes of the half, a shot from the free throw line from sophomore Tisha Dixon (Kinston) knotted the contest at 39.

The Lady Tigers responded with a 16-3 run giving them a 13-point lead, the largest of the game, with 2:31 left in the contest. With four seconds left. Dixon knocked down a pair of free throws to cut the

shortage to seven as SSU captured the 60-53 victory over the Lady Hagles.

## **Fast Start Not Enough For NCCU** Baseball In Season-**Opening Loss To** Canisius

North Carolina Central University got off to a fast start in its season-opening baseball game against Canisius Coflege on Monday night at the Durham Athletic Park.

The Eagles jumped out to a 5-1 lead over the team that upset nationally-ranked N.C. State day earlier, but the visiting Golden Griffins scored 14 unanswered runs during the next four innings to cruise to a 15-7 win over NCCU

After an uneventful first in-ning by NCCU starting pitcher Terry McNabb, the Eagles got back-to-back, one out singles by Carlos Ortiz and Tyson Simpson to set up designated hitter Carter Williamson for a three-run home run that left the ballpark in a hur-

ry over the right field fence.
With McNabb's day coming to an end after three scoreless and hitless frames on the mound. Canisius pushed home a run in the fourth inning without getting a hit, thanks to two base-on-

Ortiz got that run back plus another in the bottom of the fourth, when the rookie outfielder belted a two-run home run to right-centerfield, providing NCCU with a 5-1 advantage.

Canisius then blew the game open by scoring two runs in the fifth inning, four runs in the sixth, three more in the seventh, and finally five runs in the eighth. And while the Griffins ended up with 10 hits on the night, the hagles helped the visitors by committing three fielding errors, walking seven batters and hitting six batters with pitches. Only seven of Canisius' 15 runs were carned. NCCU's offense was sparked

by Simpson, who went 3-for 4 with a double and a run secred. and Ortiz, who hit 3-for-5 with a two-run blast and three runs scored. Williamson collected two hits, including the three-run homer, and scored twice. The only other hagle to get a hit was catcher James Dey.

Canisius was topped by se-nior outfielder Ryan Coppinger who posted an RBI triple and a two-run home run, along with three runs scored.

Senior lefty Mike Tolsma carned the win for Canisius. while sophomore hurler Andrew Vernon took the loss for the flagles.
