NCCU WOMEN'S BASKETBALL DROPS HOME FINALE TO SSU, 74-50

A 20-5 run powered by the Savannah State Lady Tigers during the final 11:33 of the first half proved to be too much for the North Carolina Central University women's basketball team to bounce back from as the Lady Eagles (10-18, 5-10 MEAC) dropped a 74-50 decision to SSU (16-13, 9-6 MEAC) during NCCU's final home contest of the season on Monday in McDougald-McLendon Gym.

The opening eight minutes of action were headed by Jessica Freeman (Charlotte, N.C.) as the redshirt senior collected eight of the Lady Eagles first 15 points, connecting on back-to-back threes, giving NCCU its largest lead of the contest at the 12:24 mark as the Lady Eagles led SSU 15-9.

Following the Lady Tigers' immense first half ending run, NCCU found itself down by 10 at the intermission as the Lady Eagles trailed SSU 31-21.

Freeman led NCCU heading into the locker room with 11 points, shooting 4-for-7 from the field and 3-for-4 from behind the arc for the Lady Eagles.

Returning to the floor for the final 20 minutes of action, NCCU was unable to rekindle its first half fire as the Lady Eagles cut the SSU lead to eight twice, but saw the Lady Tigers pull ahead by as many as 25 at the 6:20 mark.

During the closing seconds the Lady Tigers knocked down a shot from the wing, giving SSU the 24-point, 74-50 victory of the Lady Eagles.

In addition to Freeman's 11 points, juniors Racquel Davis (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and Khyra Conerly (Oakland, Calif.) also put up double-figure scoring performances during NCCU's shortcoming.

Davis added a team-best 14 points while pulling down a game-high seven boards, and Conerly collected an additional 11 points and six boards for the Lady Eagles.

The Lady Tigers were led by Senior Ezime Kalu who earned a game-best 25 points, six boards, six assists and four steals for SSU while Jasmine Kirkland led the Lady Tigers with seven rebounds.

As a team, NCCU shot 14-for-52 from the field (26.9%), 4-for-11 from behind the arc (36.4%), 18-for-31 from the free throw line (58.1%), out rebounded SSU 36-34, dished seven assists, while earning three blocks and six steals.

The Lady Eagles return to action as they close out the 2013-14 regular season on the road in Norfolk, Va., where NCCU will battle with the Norfolk State Spartans on Thursday, March 6 at 6 p.m.

LADY EAGLES EARN LARGEST CONFERENCE VICTORY ON SENIOR DAY

Freeman Collected Season-Best 28 Points over SCSU

Redshirt senior Jessica Freeman's (Charlotte, N.C.) 28-point performance helped guide the North Carolina Central University women's basketball team to its largest Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference victory of the season as the Lady Eagles (10-17, 5-9 MEAC) defeated the South Carolina State Lady Bulldogs (7-17, 5-9 MEAC) 60-43 on Saturday, March 1 in McDougald-McLendon Gym.

Following Senior Day festivities honoring Freeman and fellow senior Tiffany Gary (Delray Beach, Fla.), Freeman collected a new season-high connecting on 9-for-19 from the field, 4-for-9 from behind the arc and 6-for-7 from the free throw line while also pulling down four boards and snatching two steals.

The Lady Eagles started out hot, taking a 7-0 lead over the Lady Bulldogs in the opening two minutes of action.

SCSU answered with a 9-2 run to the tie the contest at nine with 15:04 on the first half clock.

As NCCU struggled to find its offensive momentum the Lady Bulldogs added on to their run scoring six additional points giving them their largest lead of the contest 15-9, with 11:24 on the clock.

Sophomore Tisha Dixon (Kinston, N.C.) ended the Lady Eagles five-minute scoring drought as rookie Alexis Hynes (Houston, Texas) connected with Dixon on the block at the 11:01 mark.

A 16-5 run for NCCU ended first half action as the Lady Eagles took a 26-19 advantage into the intermission.

At the half Freeman led all-scorers with seven points.

SCSU started the second half with a shot from behind the arc from Gabriel Duren in the opening seconds of action to cut NCCU's lead to four.

The Lady Eagles answered when Duren fouled Khyra Conerly (Oakland, Calif.) at the 18:28 mark and the junior knocked down one-of-two shots from the charity stripe.

Over the next minute and a half Freeman knocked down three unanswered shots from three point land putting NCCU on top by 14.

The ten-point surge was enough to keep the Lady Eagles offensive booming for the remainder of the contest as NCCU pulled ahead by as many as 19 points at the 2:50 mark.

The 17-point, 60-43 victory marks the Lady Eagles largest MEAC triumph during the 2013-14 season.

In addition to Freeman, Racquel Davis (Brooklyn, N.Y.) earned her 12th double-double of the season as the junior scored 12 points and led the game on the boards with 14 rebounds.

Duren led the way for the Lady Bulldogs on the offensive end collecting a team-best 14 points and six assists while Cherisha Floyd pulled down a team-high 12 boards during the SCSU shortcoming.

As a team, NCCU shot 19-for-50 from the field (38.0%), 6-for-15 from behind the arc (40.0%), 16-for-20 from the free throw line (80.0%), outrebounded the conference foe 42-37, collected nine assists, five blocks and six steals.
