The following letter is an instrument emitted by us last week, and which we have followed the proclamation of the Governor of Bermuda relative to licenses...

Sir—I have the honor of enclosing an order of Council, which has been judged expedient to issue, in consequence of the existing hostilities...

That if the person applying for the license shall not be able to state the name of the vessel on board of which the proposed importation is to be made...

Although the order in Council authorizes you to permit the importations of the enumerated articles in any vessel not French...

Whenever importations are proposed to be made, under the order from the U. States of America, should be by your licenses granted to the ports in the Eastern States exclusively...

When respect to the licenses for exportation on board the vessels in which an importation shall have been previously made...

You will take care that the term of the import license does not exceed the term of the order on which it is granted...

The fee payable for each license is not in any case to exceed the sum of one pound one shilling.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS I have this day been informed that the fourth Monday in May next has been fixed on for the meeting of the next Congress of the United States...

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority in me vested by an act passed at the last Session of the General Assembly, entitled 'An Act dividing the State into Districts for electing Representatives to Congress'...

In Testimony whereof, I have caused the Great Seal of the State to be hereunto affixed, and signed the same at the City of Raleigh, this eleventh day of March in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirteen...

An Act for dividing the State into Districts for Electing Representatives to Congress

BE it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of North-Carolina, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That this State shall be divided into Thirteen Districts as follows...

And be it further enacted, That the election shall be held on the same days and at the same places as are now prescribed by Law for holding elections for members to represent the several counties in the General Assembly...

And be it further enacted, That if any event shall happen to render the meeting of Congress necessary after the third of March next, and before the time herein fixed for the ensuing election of Representatives...

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in any person who shall vote more than once in any election for a representative in Congress...

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That whenever there is a case of election, the sheriff or other returning officer shall in the presence of the Inspectors of the election...

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the sheriff or other returning Officers of the counties of each district shall meet on the Thursday next after each election, at the Court-house of each county...

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That each and every person who shall be elected a representative under this act, shall, upon obtaining a certificate of his election...

And be it further enacted, That in the event of the death or resignation of any representative or representatives of this State, in the present Congress of the United States...
