MR. COCKERELL'S TOUR.

Mr C. R. Cockerell, an eminent antiquarian of Great Britain, has returned to England after an absence of more than 7 years, which were wholly devoted to the study of the fine arts in Greece and the surrounding countries.

He afterwards succeeded in excavating the Temple of Apollo Epicurius, at Paigalena, in Arcadia, where besides a very complete restoration of a temple which is described by Pausanias as one of the most beautiful in Greece.

His avocations led him into Asia Minor, where he completed the tour of the seven churches, making many drawings and observations on those remains, and collecting many inscriptions.
