ARGUES AGAINST CUT IN PRINTING TRADE HOURS

Murrill Says 44-Hour Week Means Disaster—Urges Referendum Under Present Status.

H. A. Murrill, employing printer, urged a second referendum on the proposal for a 44-hour week in printing shops in the United States. Mr. Murrill being a guest at a luncheon given by the members of the Charlotte Typographical union yesterday afternoon at the following annual meeting of the Carolina Typographical conference of the union held here.

A referendum on the issue stated was held in 1919, when Mr. Murrill said that out of 5,555 shops in the country action was taken on the 44-hour plan by only 1,562 of the total number.

After stating that the printing and allied trades were the first to feel business depression, but that war conditions had caused this fact to be overlooked, Mr. Murrill said that dealers had stocked up on high-priced goods which had to be disposed of at a loss, in order to meet financial obligations, and this, with heavy taxes, had brought many to the verge of bankruptcy and buying stopped, beginning with the color and ending with the manufacturer.

"To restore normal conditions," said Mr. Murrill, "it is necessary that the last to be affected, namely, the manufacturer, be the first to lower selling prices, and there is not a chance in the world for us to reduce our prices, after eliminating all unnecessary expenses, except by increase of production to cut down the unit of cost, or by decrease of wages."

The speaker said that plants could not run full capacity because prices that must be asked are beyond the buyers' ability to pay. It is man and machine that is wanted. He demonstrated the factor known as unit cost of production and said when the plant is running at full unit production, the proportion of wages entering into the cost is reduced, to a point where a higher rate of pay can be maintained than if wage percentage is high on account of low unit production.

Mr. Murrill said the same principle applied to working hours, except that reduced hours affect overhead distribution. He declared that after a careful study of all the conditions to be met, the employing printers were convinced that the step contemplated, namely to urge continuation of 44-hour week, would be as beneficial to employers as to employees.

Mr. Murrill said the business condition had passed when increased costs could be passed on to the consumer, and that while union heads and members had asked for the shorter-hour scale when good conditions prevailed, now it was the duty of all to accept the changed state of things and for union leaders and union men to accept the new order that has been thrust on the country by reason of a necessity for lower costs.

"The market could not stand it and nothing could be done by us to remedy that condition," said the speaker, referring to a reduction of hours at this time.

Conditions in the building trades, where many men have been forced to idleness because of excessive wages and low production, according to Mr. Murrill, will furnish a parallel in the printing trades. The speaker closed with a prediction that adoption of a 44-hour week and a consequent increase in production costs cannot and will not be anything but disastrous to all concerned.

SEMI-ANNUAL CAROLINA CONFERENCE HERE YESTERDAY—MEET IN GREENSBORO IN OCTOBER.

A 44-hour week, or an 8-hour day for five days in the week, and a half holiday on Saturday, was the leading subject before the semi-annual session of the Carolina Typographical conference, held in the hall of the Charlotte Typographical union yesterday.

James F. Barrett, of Asheville, president, with Secretary Frank J. Torlay, of Charleston, S. C., and D. L. Campbell, of Norfolk, Va., representing the international union, in attendance.

Following the business sessions a banquet was held at Ivey's at 8:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon at which talks were made by Mr. Campbell, official organizer for this district, H. A. Murrill, employing printer, J. F. Barrett, F. J. Torlay, and others.

The following statement regarding the 44-hour week was made after the formal sessions of the Carolina conference were concluded:

"The agreement for the peaceful introduction of this shorter work-week was entered into several years ago, but the master printers' associations of the United States and Canada, so it is claimed, and some of the employers have announced their intention to oppose the agreement, and fight the shorter work-week."

"Reports made by the various delegates present at the conference, however, show that the opposition is diminishing, and it is believed that by May 1 nearly all employers in this section will see the wisdom of abiding by the agreement."

The International Typographical union is the wealthiest labor organization in the world, and in making preparations to oppose the open shop movement they have accumulated a defense fund of more than \$2,000,000, and on May 1 will levy an assessment on its membership which will yield more than \$1,000,000 a month.

"The delegates present expressed entire confidence in the ability of the organization to successfully combat any effort to enforce open shop conditions on the I. T. U."

"The American Newspapers Publishers' association has an arbitration agreement with the International Typographical union and the newspapers will not be affected by the 44-hour week."

The conference adjourned at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon to meet in Greensboro in October.

CIVIC PROBLEMS TALKED AT CITIZENSHIP MEETING

H. C. Jones, T. T. Allison and J. W. Holt, Jr., Tell of Needs in Several Lines.

Civic problems constituted the chief consideration of the meeting of the citizenship class of the Charlotte Woman's club held last night at the club house, Mrs. B. D. Williams presiding.

Hamilton C. Jones, representing the Rotary club, in the absence of Julian Miller, spoke on need along reformatory lines; T. T. Allison, of the chamber of commerce, spoke on "Markets," and Joseph W. Holt, Jr., representing the Kiwanis club, spoke on "The City Beautiful."

Mrs. J. E. Reilly, president of the club, followed the men and gave a resume of the activities of the woman's club since its organization in 1919, telling in humorous vein of the early attempts along civic lines and of the success that has attended these efforts during the period of its existence.

Mr. Jones spoke of the increased work of the Associated Charities and suggested a \$20,000 budget for the work of this organization, asking for greater support from the citizens of the city from whom will result many social benefits. He also made a plea for a colored reformatory, giving his experiences as juvenile judge to bear out his statement of the demand. The Mecklenburg cottage at the Stonewall Jackson training school will in large measure solve the problem with relation to the white boys, he believed.

A plea was made by Mr. Jones for facilities for caring for the indigent sick of the city, explaining that the charity wards of the hospitals are doing what they can along this line. A detention house for children was suggested as another need, the juvenile court and Associated Charities having records of 35 or 40 children who should be looked after.

In speaking of markets, Mr. Allison suggested a wholesale market for the city. He spoke of the failure of the retail market here as a result of imperfect cooperation between the housewives and retailers. Mecklenburg will be glad to supply and Charlotte will be glad to receive the necessities of life, if the market point can be worked out, he said. Home grown products could be handled through grocers and butchers, with cold storage and canning plants as adjuncts, Mr. Allison said.

Mr. Holt spoke earnestly in favor of the park and playground plans, urging the planting of more trees and shrubbery and of replacing trees that have died in the avenues of trees. He warned against leasing business houses, stores, filling stations, and like businesses, mar the beauty of residential areas. More consideration of the beautiful in the negro sections was asked by Mr. Holt, who urged his hearers to make their own yards and streets beautiful and this would spread over a large section in a short time.
