GOLDEN SHORE.

Fabulous Richness of the Sands Along the Northern Coast of California.

The San Francisco Chronicle of Mar. 23d says: The fact has already been mentioned in the Chronicle that a number of gentlemen of New York and San Francisco were fitting out an expedition to the northern coast for the purpose of working the rich auriferous deposits known to exist along the shore of Klamath county, between Trinidad and Redding Rock.
