Trial of Joseph Baker for the Murder of Newton Wilfong.

THE TRIAL.—The State continued the examination of witnesses. C. Severs was called to the stand. He testified that on the occasion of the killing he had no knife; further testified that he did not strike Wilfong with the axe-haft in putting him out of the house. Frederick Severs, clerk in the store of H. Severs, was called and shown the knife which it is alleged Baker stabbed Wilfong with. Said that he had knives of a kind in the store and had sold Baker a knife...

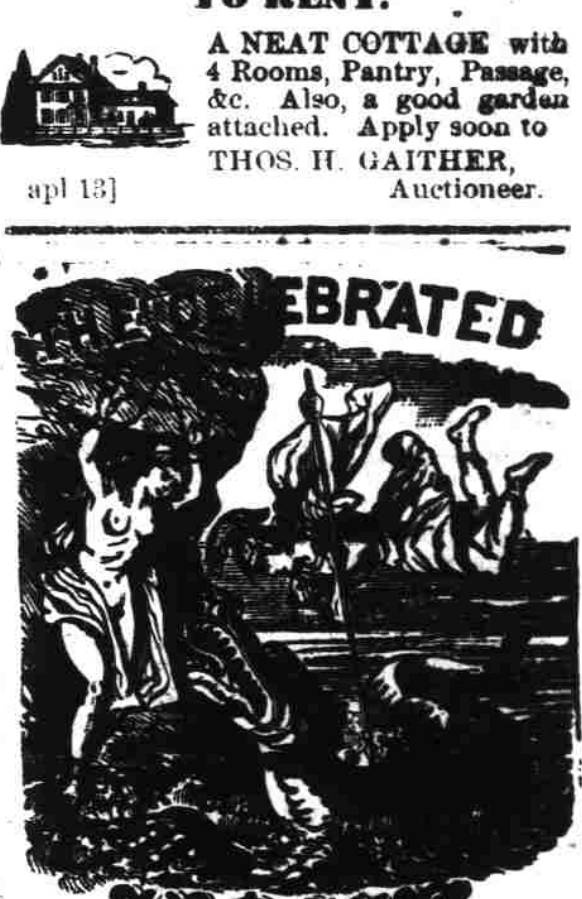
