The Diocese of North Carolina was organized in the year 1794 by the election of the Rev. Chimies Pettigrew the grandfisher of the lanceted and highly distinguished Gen. Jas. The Convention is composed of two orders, Clerical and Lay. Every clergyman of the Church who has been for twelve calendar months connected with the Diocese is entitled to a seat, and every clergyman who has received letters dimissory from other Dioceses. Each regularly organized l'arish is entitled to send four lay delegates. This Diocese has always been distinguished for its high-toned Churchmanship, and has sent many






