

The living actors will soon pass away, and much valuable information, unless gath ered now, will be lost forever. Hence, after waiting for several years for some one more competent to undertake the task, I have determined to devote the remaining years of my life to this labor of love. I vield to none in love for my native State, or in admiration for the gallant men who

have shed imperishable glory upon her. I prefer to give these accounts first in newspaper form, in order that omissions and errors, if any occur, may be pointed out and corrected before the work shall pass into more enduring form which it will assume, should it prove what I desire to make it, a valuable acquisition to the war record of the South.

In endeavoring to do justice to the soldiers of my native State, I certainly shall most carefully abstain from doing injustice to those from any other.
