



EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, \ RALEIGH, June 10, 1873. WHEREAS, Official information has been received at this Department that vacancies exist in the Senate branch of the General Assembly of North Carolina by reason of the resignation of HIRAM E. STILLEY and J. B. RESPESS, representing the Second Senatorial District, and that vacancies exist in the House of Representatives of the said General Assembly by reason of the resignation of ALFRED J. MORRISON representative from Lincoln County and

RICHARD C. BADGER representative from Wake county. Now, therefore, I Top R. Caldwell, Governor of the State of North Carolina, by virtue of authority in me vested by law do issue this my Proclamation, commanding the Sheriffs of the counties composing the Second Senatorial District of North Carolina to open polls and hold an election at the usual voting places in said counties on THURSDAY THE SEVENTH DAY OF AUGUST, A. D., 1872, for two Senators; and I do further command the Sheriffs of Lincoln and Wake counties to open polls and hold elections in their re-1873, for a member of the House of Representatives, all of said elections to be held, votes compared and returns made in all respects in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina.
