

aid of all my brother soldiers, and ask them to furnish me material which can be arranged and digested so as to form a com-plete record of the heroic deeds of the sons of Yorth Carolina upon the battle fields of the Confederacy; and especially do ask all who can write to furnish me details of every battle in which they participated, and the part borne by their immediate com-

The time may not have come to write this portion of North Carolina's History; but it has come to collect material and arrange it for the use of the future historian. The living actors will soon pass away, and much valuable information, unless gath ered now, will be lost forever. Hence, after waiting for several years for some one more competent to undertake the task, I have determined to devote the remaining years of my life to this labor of love. I vield to none in love for my native State, or in admiration for the gallant men who have shed imperishable glory upon her. I prefer to give these accounts first in newspaper form, in order that omissions

pass into more enduring form which it will assume, should it prove what I desire to make it, a valuable acquisition to the war record of the South. 
