## CHICAGO.

#### Prayer for a Repeal of the Act Exempting Certain Church Property from Taxation-The Case of ex-Treasurer Gage.

CHICAGO, March 5 .- A petition is being circulated and signed in this city, asking Congress to repeal the act exempting church property in the District of Columbia from taxation, on the ground that the act is unconstitutional, unjust and unsafe. The special reasons given are that such exemption is equivalent to a direct appropriation by Congress for the support of the churches and consequently unconstitutional; that it increases the taxes of other parts of the country, and that accumulation of property in the hands of ecclesi-astical bodies is dangerous.

It is possible that the case of ex-Treasurer Gage may not be tried till November though it may be sooner.

# NEW YORK.

#### The Reported Death of Cespedes Discredited-Defeat of the Spaniards by the Cubans-Plans of the Crusaders-Excitement in Ecclesiastical Circles.

NEW YORK, March 5.—The rumored death of ex-President Cespedes, of the Republic of Cuba, is generally disbelieved by the Cubans here, who regard it as a Spanish canard intended to dishearten the patriots and in jure their cause. The latest news received through Cuban sources are most encouraging. In Camaguey the Cubans have more men and horses than the Spaniards. On the 9th of January a battle was fought at Melons, between 600 Cubans, partly cavalry, and 1,300 Spaniards. The Spaniards being numerically much stronger, drove the Cubans before them, and entered the Cuban camp, when the Cuban cavalry repulsed them. The Spaniards retreated, leaving 42 dead bodies on the field.






