At the end of the war he again settled at Petersburg, and was connected with the Southside Railroad, for some time, until he was made agent of the Southern Dispatch Fast Freight Line. Since his connection with this line he has made Charlotte his headquarters, and here he was known to many of our citizens as a high-toned, dignified gentieman, one of highly polished manners and most pleasing address, and a man who hated from the bottom of a true and generous soul, whatever was mean or dis-
