Spring.—Several reports were in circulation yesterday, relative to trou-bles between the white and colored people at Ridge Spring, on the line of the Charlotte, Columbia and Augutsa Railrand. It seems that several colored companies were drilling and drumbeating until a very late hour Monday night, while the stragglers made threats as to what they would do if the whites interferred, or wanted "anything out of them." The whites becoming incensed and at the same time fearful that trouble might ensue. sent runners around the neighborhood and collected a number of armed citizens, who, yesterday morning, were prepared to quell any disturbance. There was, however, fortunately no collision, and when the evening train for Columbia passed, none of the colored troops were visible-having quietly dispersed, leaving the whites in peaceful possession of the field .-The nearest telegraphic station to Ridge is Batesville-ten milss.
