As for the origin of the quarrel we know nothing, but the result was that Smith struck Gaddy on the head with a rock. The skull of the wounded man was thought to be fractured, and an hour after the occurrence his condition was critical.

Tragedy in Gaston County.
A Man Shoots and Instantly Kills His Son-in-Law.
Messrs. Editors: I have to chronicle a tragedy which took place near Cherryville station on the Carolina Central Railway, on Wednesday last. Mr. Benjamin McGinnis, of Gaston county, was shot by his father-in-law, James Moore, at the latter's residence a day or two ago. Mr. McGinnis, when intoxicated, had been unkind to his wife. She deserted him, and going to her father's home, refused to live with him again. McGinnis, armed with a pistol a few days after this event, went to Moore's house and a difficulty ensued about the children. Moore, desirous of avoiding a personal encounter, had barricaded the doors and ordered his son-in-law, McGinnis shot at Moore twice but missed him. He then attempted to cut down the door with an axe, when Moore opening the window, shot him in the breast. McGinnis fell dead, with an axe in one hand and pistol in the other. As Moore was defending his own life and every man's home is his castle, it appears that Moore was justifiable in this sad tragedy.

He soon as the boy found it beyond his power to control the animal, he dropped the reins, and with a commendable tenacity held on until the mule was stopped, perhaps saved him serious injury; as it was he came off unhurt, though, of course, much frightened. The affair created a good deal of interest on the street.

Postmasters are not required by law to receive or accept in payment of post office dues, money-orders, stamps or stamped envelopes, any currency which may be so utilized as to be uncurrent, nor is it any part of their duty to receive and transmit to the Treasury for redemption mutilated currency belonging to individuals except as regular mail matters forwarded in the usual manner, at the risk of the owner. Such packages, if addressed and registered to the Treasurer of the United States, Washington, D. C., will be sent free of the postoffice fee, but the postage must be paid in full at letter rates.
