The session of the convention was marked with very violent and disorderly scenes.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8.—Information has been received at the Department of Justice, that several of the parties engaged in the outrage in Tennessee and Alabama have been located, and that as soon as the U. S. Marshals can get the assistance of the Federal troops arrests will be made. The Governors of the Western Territories have been requested to prevent the movement of any and all expeditions from the Territories to the country known as the Black Hills. They have also been notified that Gen. Sheridan's order on the subject will be rigidly enforced.
