NOON DISPATCHES.

FOREIGN.

Vessels Wrecked and in Distress - Re-Union of Maximilian's Companions Bismarck not to become a Duke - The Prospects of Peace in France, &c.

New York, March 29. - London dispatches say that a vessel has been wrecked off Donaritz, France, and all hands are supposed to have perished.

The bank "L'Union" from Pensacola for Liverpool, was spoken on March 10th in distress, making for Cologne.

Bismarck will not become Duke of Lauenburg.

TREISTE, March 29. - All the companions of the Emperor Maximilian, who shared his exploits in Mexico, are invited to attend the erection of his monument in April.

PARIS, March 29. - Edger Quimet, author and member of the Assembly from Paris, is dead.

LONDON, March 29. - The "Theophilus St. Mark's," for Havre, founded. The crew was saved.

BERLIN, March 29. - The Roman Catholic Bishops of Prussia are to hold a conference at Diele on Tuesday.

LONDON, March 29. - The Spanish government announces that six Carlist generals, three colonels and many other officers have entered France and declared their adhesion to King Alfonso.

A telegram from Santander asserts, on the other hand, that the hope of settling the war by a convention is a fast-dying one.

WASHINGTON, March 29. - The Gift Concert of the Montpelier Female Humane Association, advertised to take place at Alexandria, Va., to-morrow, is postponed for a short time in order to have a full distribution.

Walker, the great caterer, is dead. The Pardee matter may be considered closed.

Attorney-General Williams has telegraphed Circuit Judge Wood, that he cannot make a District Judge for Louisiana.

Revocation of a Liberal Will. SAN FRANCISCO, March 29. - James Lick has filed in the Recorder's office a revocation of the trust deed executed last July conveying his property to trustees for various benevolent purposes, and he recites in the revocation that he wishes to provide for parties having natural claims on him, to amend original instrument, and wish returning health to give his personal attention to the execution of his designs.

ILLINOIS. Reduction of Railroad Fares. CHICAGO, March 29. - The Michigan Central, Michigan Southern, and Pittsburgh and Fort Wayne, Railroads, have reduced their fares to Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, and Washington tickets at reduced rates limited to 45 hours.

TEXAS. Outrages by Mexicans on the Border. GALVESTON, March 29. - Special dispatches from the Rio Grande border state that at least three hundred Mexican bandits of the Texas coast, have murdered several Americans near the border.

MIDNIGHT DISPATCHES. NEW YORK. Tilden's Message Approved. SYRACUSE, March 29. - A large meeting of Ex-Mayor Groves presiding with a large number of Vice Presidents, selected equally from each political party, today endorsed Tilden's message.

FOREIGN. Meeting of the Tichborne Adherents. LONDON, March 29. - The committee in the Tichborne case, called a meeting at Hyde Park, a hundred thousand assembled. There were bands and flags. The horses were taken down by the men. The proceedings were resolutions that there would be no rest until the enormous judicial crime was eradicated.

WASHINGTON. The Georgia Storm to be Investigated - Important Case Decided - Spinner Resigns, &c. &c. WASHINGTON, March 29. - The Chief Signal Officer has reported to his superiors to Georgia to investigate and report upon the recent destructive tornado in that State.

The Court of Claims has decided the Hot Springs case against the five several claimants to the property, which remains with the United States. Judge Loring dissented, believing the evidence established Rector's claim. An appeal is taken to the Supreme Court.

Paymaster Eckles has been assigned to the department of the Gulf. Treasurer Spinner has resigned, to take effect on the first of July. J. N. New, of Indianapolis, succeeds him.
