Green Tomato Pickles. "One half bushel green tomatoes; one half peck onions, two hard heads of cabbage. Cut the above very fine, and salt down separately overnight, and squeeze out in the morning perfectly dry; then mix together, then in a stone jar lay first a layer of the pickles, and then a layer of spices, &c., with a plenty of table mustard and horse-radish, and then cover with cold vinegar. Spice to your taste. Put in also green pepper."

The Contested Election Case. The Board of County Commissioners will meet to-day at the Court House for consideration of the contested election case, and for action upon the vote on the stock law.

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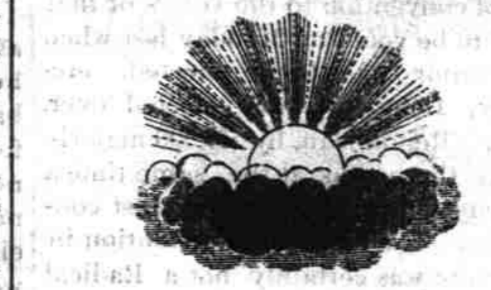
