

STATE NEWS.

A Nash county lamb has just been born with three legs. Joshua Robbins, of Randolph county, was killed last week by a falling tree limb.

They are already beginning to walk out of Concord's new jail whenever they get tired staying in there. Still another case of small-pox has been developed in Wilmington. The premises are guarded.

A German dance club has been organized in Raleigh, which is proud that she is the first place in the State to introduce the German. Mr. R. A. Carter, of Polkton, Anson county, who recently lost his store house by fire, was insured by the recently suspended Penn Fire Insurance Company, and has never been paid off.

On Wednesday last a child of John S. Mydgett, at Parkville, Pasquotank county, aged five months, fell from his chair into the fire and was so badly burned that he died on Friday.

The Ansonian learns that a negro woman living near White Store in Anson county, fell off a "foot log" on which she was crossing Little Brown Creek and was drowned. There were some twenty other negroes present, who we learn, made no effort to rescue her.

The Rockingham Courier says that a difficulty occurred on Tuesday last at Laurel Hill, Richmond county, between two railroad hands, and one struck the other on the head with a tool of some kind and inflicted, it is thought a fatal wound. The negro inflicting the wound was arrested and lodged in jail.

Raleigh News: He had been sick for months and married for ten years and had just crawled out looking as poor as a snake, and was sitting sunning himself in the portico of the National Hotel, when he beckoned a party across the street, to come to him, and he told him to get on his feet that he had just seen a country girl drive a wagon by with one foot on the axle, and she had the prettiest foot and ankle that he ever saw in his life.

The Tarboro Southerner says that Wiley Strickland about two years ago set a gun in his hand, about two miles from Nashville for the purpose of retaining a little of his corn which had been disappearing very rapidly. One night hearing the report of his gun, he got up, dressed and proceeded to his gun to find a colored man named Pettiford, lying in a dying condition, shot through the heart. Fortunately Mr. R. escaped serious injury, the knife passing through his vest and two shirts and making a slight flesh wound.

In Columbia, on Saturday evening, a young son of June Mobley was accidentally shot at the residence of his father, on Arsenal hill. The wound is painful but not necessarily dangerous or fatal.

Last Wednesday, about 11 o'clock in the morning, a girl child of Emily Milligan, three years and five months old, was burned to death in the upper part of Richland county. Esau and his wife left their little girl in the yard with a younger child, and while the parents were at a neighbor's, a little over a quarter of a mile away, grinding an axe, the fatal burning occurred.

Windsboro News: The seventh judicial circuit seems about to be bereft of two very important adjuncts. Solicitor Flemming was, on the 15th inst., in the court of general sessions for Richland county, convicted of drunkenness while in the discharge of his official duties. This offense is punishable with fine and imprisonment, and works a forfeiture of office. Judge Montgomery Moses is likewise in a bad way. All the preliminary arrangements have been made for his impeachment, and if what we hear is true, his chances are decidedly slim. His doffing of the judicial gown would cause no regret whatever—except, perhaps, in the limited circle of the Moses family.

Stock Raising: It has been successfully demonstrated that the dairy business pays well in this country. Mr. Robert Lynn, who lives near Independence, on the Jackson railroad, sixty-five miles north of New Orleans, has a few Jersey cattle, six in number, and two of them quite young, from which he has made and sold, since the first of April, 560 pounds of butter. Mr. Lynn conducts his dairy in the best possible manner, and the butter brings him forty cents per pound in this market. The only feed that his cattle have had during the time, was feed raised on his place, the pasture, and 1,000 pounds of cotton seed meal. It is now conceded by the best and thriftest farmers that profitable farming is impossible without a fair amount of stock. Cattle, sheep and hogs collect and turn to profitable account the "odds and ends" on the farm. They are the gleaners that save an interest and pay the husbandman.—Son of the Soldier.
