HAVANA, March 22.—The yacht Octavia, recently captured by a Spanish war vessel, has arrived at Porto Rico. She sailed under an English flag. She cleared for New York and had thirty-six men and two women on board.

NEW YORK. Reduction in the Production of Straw Goods—Republican Convention. NEW YORK, March 22.—The American Straw Goods Association has agreed to reduce its production one half. This will reduce the production to 40,000 in two weeks.
