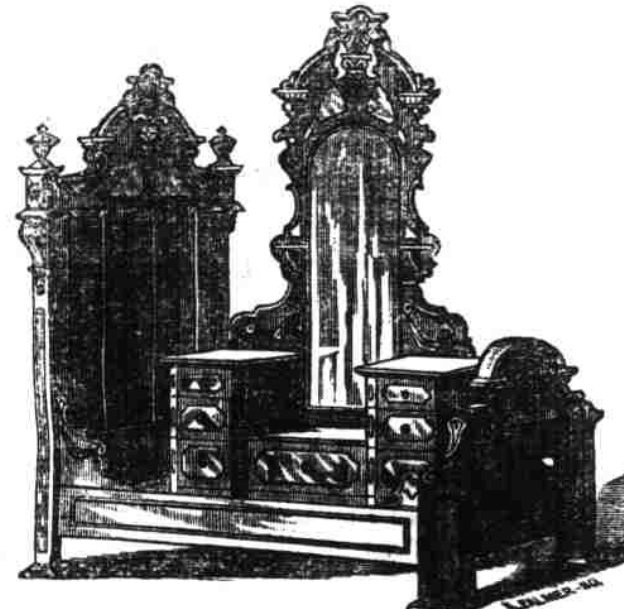

WASHINGTON.

The Safe Burglary Case Becoming Exciting—Babcock Involved—Ugly Rumors About Bristow—They Say He has Resigned and He Denies.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 7.—Gossip: The safe burglary examination is becoming very exciting. This was a conspiracy to rob the safe of the District Attorney and place the contents in the possession of Columbus Alexander in order to connect him criminally with the transaction.

There are wild rumors that Bristow has resigned in consequence of Henderson's testimony, in which Bristow is made to say that he had no confidence in the administration.
