

VIRGINIA.

Accident to Excursionists-No One Killed.

RICHMOND, May 16 .- Later and authentic reports of the accident to the military excursion train on the Petersburg Road, show that the report telegraphed last night was considerably exaggerated. The news was based upon information received from the first parties arriving from the scene of the accident. It is now known that no one was killed.
