WASHINGTON.

Interior Department Denies—Protest Against Free Rice—The Committee Report in Favor of Rainey vs. Lee—Gibson's Committee's Work.

WASHINGTON, May 23.—The Times' special says ex-Senator Alexander McDonald, of Arkansas, testified before the Committee on Expenditures in the Interior Department, yesterday.

In the Senate, Robertson, of South Carolina, presented resolutions of the Charleston Chamber of Commerce, remonstrating against the admission of rice free of duty as proposed by the Hawaiian treaty; referred to the Committee on Finance.

FOREIGN.

Contents of the English Note to the Berlin Conference—The Sultan Probably to Abdicate.

LONDON, May 23.—The English note declining to agree to the Berlin conference, is that it contains the principle of armed intervention, and is a menace to the liberty and independence of Turkey.

BERLIN, May 23.—Intelligence has been received in official quarters, indicating that the Sultan will probably be compelled to abdicate very shortly.

MARINE.

Vessel Struck in a Fog.

WASHINGTON, May 22.—The signal office reports the bark Rebecca Cavanna, New York for New Orleans, Capt. Thomson, eleven men all told, loaded with barrel staves, struck in fog at 5 P. M. yesterday near Brock Haven, fifteen miles south of Barnegat Inlet.

FLASHES.

ATLANTA, May 23.—The acreage of oats is 135 compared to last year, or 135 per cent increase of acreage of last year's crop.

MEMPHIS, May 23.—Judge Emmons ordered the sale of 118 miles of the Mobile & Ohio Railroad, within the State of Tennessee, with rolling stock to satisfy the bondholders who held the lien of the State on said road.

BALTIMORE, May 23.—Austral won the 3 mile dash.

TRENTON, May 23.—The resolutions were in favor of hard money and Joel Parker.

GLoucester, May 23.—Five fishing vessels and forty-seven lives have been lost in the Gloucester fisheries this season.

NEW ORLEANS, May 23.—The Picayune says 29 negroes were killed in Wilkinson county, Miss., during the recent troubles there.

WEATHER PROBABILITIES.

WASHINGTON, May 23. In the South Atlantic and East Gulf States, rising barometer, northerly to easterly winds, and cooler, partly cloudy weather will prevail, with rain areas in the southern portions.

GEORGIA.

The Late State Treasurer in Trouble—Jones Arrested.

ATLANTA, May 23.—Yesterday, the Grand Jury of this county found a true bill against the late State Treasurer Jones, for illegally withholding money from the State, to the amount of \$110,274.84.

Jones was arrested this morning and required to give a ten thousand dollar bond, which has not yet been given.

MISSOURI.

The Gas Works of St. Louis Decided to Belong to the City.

St. Louis, May 23.—Judge Goldschalk, of the Circuit Court, this morning decided that the gas works have belonged to the city since January 1st, 1870, and that all revenues received by them since that time belong to the city.

WASHINGTON.

Howard Denies—Bristow Not to Resign—Proceedings in Congress—Pierpont and Taft at the Cabinet Meeting—The District Committee Report—Fish Reiterates, &c.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 23.—Gen O O Howard denies having been Trustee of the Freedman's Bank.

Assistant Secretary Conant says the story of Bristow's resignation is the sheerest nonsense. The House went immediately into Committee on the Naval Appropriations. Some five amendments are pending regarding the navy yards over which there are local struggles.

SENATE.—The resolution requesting the Secretary of the Treasury to furnish a detailed estimate of the amount required to execute House bill amendatory of the law pensioning the soldiers and sailors of 1812, was adopted. Secret session on the impeachment.

Pierpont as Attorney General, and Taft as Secretary of War, appeared as usual at the Cabinet meeting to-day. Pierpont will not relinquish the Attorney Generalship until he formally accepts the new office which from certain necessities he cannot do until about the first of June.

Ferguson who went with the sub-committee to the Treasury Department has examined some six hundred pay rolls, but failed to find any he could identify as signed fraudulently himself. The committee adjourned to go to New Orleans.

It is stated on good authority that the President has ordered the suspension of Wickershaw, post master at Mobile.

The Committee on the District of Columbia have concluded their report making seven columns. The joint resolution which they offer, directs the Attorney General to cause proceedings at law to be instituted against the Commissioners, Wm Dennison, John H Ketcham and Seth L Phelps, on their several bonds, for malfeasance and unfaithfulness in office, and for this purpose he is authorized to employ special counsel. The Republican members will refuse to join in the report, they holding that the Commissioners are not responsible for the actions of the Board of Audit, where the responsibility properly belongs.

A three hours' cabinet session was held to-day. Secretary Fish's notes were read. It is quite a long paper and thoroughly reiterates the position already taken by this government. Bristow read a telegram, from Supervisor Magee, at St. Louis, reciting the difficulty in executing the revenue laws in Cape Guardian county, Me., and asking for military force. The matter was referred to the Secretary of War, who will instruct the proper military authorities to give proper assistance.

Judge Taft remains in charge of the War office a few days. Senator Logan occupied the day in the Impeachment Court, arguing against the jurisdiction. The decision is expected Thursday.

NEW YORK.

Bad Ventilation in the New Court House—Vanderbilt Weak—Ordered to Show Cause—Catholic Baptism Referred Back.

NEW YORK, May 23.—Bad ventilation in the new Court House is entailing serious consequences. Four Judges are sick and unable to attend their courts to-day. Judge Donahue had to be carried home from an attack of vertigo.

Commodore Vanderbilt is very weak. His physicians are in constant attendance.

Jay Gould and Sydney Dillon have been ordered to show cause why they should not be punished for contempt in not appearing for examination, in the suit of Rufus F Hatch, as ordered last week.

The Presbyterian Assembly Committee on overtures from the Synod of Missouri, in reference to retaining the Catholic baptism, reported that they had carefully considered the subject and referred it back to the Assembly for its further consideration. The Committee on Home Missions made a very favorable, but partial report; there are now 1,085 men engaged in the work, and the church should sustain them.

FOREIGN.

Winslow Remanded—Sailors Hung—Action Postponed.

LONDON, May 23.—At the request of the Attorney General, Winslow was further remanded for eight days.

Meantime the Government will take measures to bring the case before the court of Queen's Bench.

Four Greek sailors, of the British ship Louise, who mutinied and murdered the Captain, mates and second officer, who were convicted and sentenced, were executed to-day at New Gate, aged 21, 22, 23 and 33.

In the House, the Secretary stated that the Winslow papers up to date would be submitted to the House. The Under Secretary of the Foreign Department, stated that the Cubans captured on the Octavia, had not been released, but Spain promised to take no action regarding them till an arrangement between the Governments was reached.
