

WASHINGTON.

Allow the President to Call for Arkansas 98, Tennessee 120. Volunteers for Indian War.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 15 .- The House passed a bill authorizing the President to raise five thousand volunteers for the Indian war, and appropriated a million dollars for the expenses.

The Senate at an early hour this morning rejected a substitute for the House's amendment to the Constitution, relating to schools-28 to 16. Not two-thirds. Adjourned at two o'clock. Both Houses meet at noon.

The situation of the school amend ment is as follows: Blaine's amendment was passed by the House, and was amended in the Senate by a majority vote, and the question being on the proposition as amended, it was rejected for want of a constitutional two-thirds vote. The original resolution falls with the amendment to the Constitution, and is rejected. The Monday night's session of the House continued till six o'clock this morning.
