

STATE NEWS.

The Edgecombe County Republican Convention, which met recently at Tarboro, nominated W. P. Mabson, col. for the Senate, and Willis Bunn, col. for the House.

They are going extensively into the business of distilling the oil of pennyroyal in Cabarrus. It sells readily for \$1.50 per pound, and is said to pay the manufacturers handsomely. Two hands can easily gather a wagon load of the sweet smelling weed in a day.

Raleigh Sentinel: The other day David Fronberger, of Gaston county, shipped from his vineyard, in that county a large lot of grapes to a commission merchant in this place. The merchant refused to pay the express charges on them on account of the market here being stocked from the Thomasberg vineyard near this city, and the grapes are now rotting in the express office.

The following is a list of the Democratic nominees from the county of Robeson: For the House—Col. Murdoch McKee and Alf. Rowland, Esq. The sheriff, R. McMillan, and the Register, S. E. Ward were both renominated. Messrs. D. S. Morrison, J. T. Pope, H. F. Pitman, and Alex. Humphrey and Capt. W. J. Tolar, were nominated for county commissioners.

Shelly Banner: We learn that the Rads of Rutherford county met in grand convocation at Rutherford last Monday, and nominated Boy Hampton for the Senate, Jim Justice for the House, Noah Walker, son of the ex-sheriff, for sheriff—in fact, a full ticket, but we have not all the names. It is said that there exists a great deal of dissatisfaction in the ranks of the "mats" and that there is much talk of a bolt. A J. Scoggin came very near being nominated for sheriff.

Raleigh Sentinel: Professor Kerr, the state geologist, arrived Friday evening from the centennial where he has been sojourning for some time past. He leaves to-day for Asheville, where he will join Professors Julien and Bolton, of Columbia college, New York, and enter upon a general geological survey of most of our transmontane counties. In about three weeks the party will be joined by Dr. P. S. Hunt, of the Pennsylvania geological survey, and other distinguished geologists in the world. The counties proposed to be surveyed are said by scientists to be of the most interesting geological fields in the world, and is at present exciting great interest.

AND STILL THEY COME.—Mr. B. F. Parrott, of Lenoir county, formerly a Republican Representative, during the speaking in Kinston on Thursday last, announced himself for Tilden, Vance, Jarvis and the State ticket. Good! And by way of keeping the ball in motion we make the following extract from a letter received from a Greene county friend. He says: "I was at La Grange on Wednesday last and met my old friend Dr. M. F. Arendell, a Carteret county man, now doing business at Falling Creek. Said he to me: 'I am done with the radical party. When I see with my own eyes that the country is rapidly going to ruin, I think it high time that every honorable man should enroll under the banner of reform. For one former republican I shall support the democratic national and State tickets, and firmly believe that Vance will carry this State by 15,000 to 20,000 majority. The Dr. named several former republicans of prominence in Carteret who have avowed that they will support the democratic ticket this year.' The same friend writes us that H. E. Dillon, Esq., a prominent merchant at La Grange, has likewise renounced republican allegiance, and has enrolled himself a member of the La Grange Tilden and Vance Club. The good work goes bravely on.—Columbia Messenger.
