NEW YORK. Railroad Strike—Frosts in New York and Pennsylvania. New York, Aug. 21.—Arrived, England. The employees of the New York and New Jersey Railroad comprising engineers, conductors, brakemen and truckmen, struck yesterday morning, and since that time traffic over the road has been entirely suspended. The strike was caused by the non payment of four months wages, and also the protesting of the men, for payment of their wages for four months previous. Frosts last night at Port Jarvis, New York, and Milford, Pennsylvania.

MID-NIGHT DISPATCHES. WEATHER PROBABILITIES. WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 21. During Tuesday in the South Atlantic and East Gulf States, higher barometer, northeast to southeast winds, and partly cloudy weather will prevail, with possibly occasional rains in Southern portions.

WASHINGTON. Changes in the Revenue Department. J. J. Mott Retained in North Carolina—Collectors in Georgia and Alabama. WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 21.—Vice President Ferry will accompany the remains of Mr. Kerr to New Albany, Indiana. J. J. Mott is retained as Internal Revenue Collector for the consolidated Sixth and Seventh Districts of North Carolina. Mr. McCalla is retained in Georgia, relieving Fanning, who was originally retained under the consolidation of the First and Third Districts of Georgia. Clooke is also retained in the original consolidation order. Alabama was made a single district, but a change has now been made, and the State is divided into two districts. The Collectors retained being Myers of Mobile, and Booker.
