

E. R. Kinnedy, Esq.

My Dear Sir:—I thank you for the compliment conveyed in your note of the 29th, and regret that a proposed trip to California prevents my being in Brooklyn on the day you name. Of course, I am pleased to note the honor in which you hold the national emblems which we followed to the sea, and that you number among your posed that army. I must not be a partisan, because I have chosen to dedicate my few remaining years to my profession, which is eminently national, leaving every citizen free to choose his own course in life, and to ally his civil fortunes to any of the parties into which a free people always divide for the varied interests that always do arise.

London, Sept. 9.—No new military movements are reported from the seat of war to-day but report telegraphed from Deligrade to Daily News and generally until the 15th or 20th. 
