FOREIGN.

Particulars of Tweed's Arrest-Turko-Servian War Items.

LONDON, Sept 11 .- A special dispatch from Burgos to the Daily News, states that Tweed was arrested at Pondevedra, where he landed from a sailing ressel on which he escaped from Cuba. Mr Adle, in charge of affairs of the United States in the absence of Minister Cushing, visited the Spanish minister of foreign affairs at La Grange, and arranged for the surrender of the prisoner to the American Government. The Spanish authorities had been notified of Tweed's sailing for Spain, and preparations had been made for his arrest, long before his arrival.

BELGRADE, Sept 11-There is little change in the Servian campaign. Tchernayeff's prospects are brighter than they were a week ago. The Turks evidently wish to pass Alexinatz and take Deligrade by a flank movement, but that purpose has been checked by the advance of Harvatowitch, and it is clear that they will still have to fight a decisive Lattle. There are no signs of the war-like spirit abating in Ser-

Madrid, Sept 11-The following are Wm M Tweed. Captain General Joveller at Havana, received entelligence that Tweed had disembarked at Santiago de Cuba, and notified the authorities there. Before the latter could take action Tweed had embarked aboard the vessel Carmer, bound to Vigo. Capt ed the authorities at all Spanish ports | is already reduced. to examine the persons on board all vessels named Carmer. There are 12 Spanish vessels of that name. The portraits of Tweed being indispensable for his identification, the Spanish authorities obtained and made copies of the caricature in the American journal representing hmi as beating a child, supposed to tipify American justice. This carrieature, led the Spanish authorities and reporters of Spanish papers, to believe that Tweed had been kidnapping children; hence, in the first official announcement received there of the arrest of Tweed, which is supposed to have been telegraphed, the corruption of Tweed's American career not being known, it was stated that he had been arrested for kidnapping American children. Tweed is still confined on the Isle of St Sunor, in Vigo Bay, where he is undergoing a quarantine, and is strictly watched by custom house guards. At the expiration of his quarantine, he will be surrendered to the United States representative, as there are no direct steamers between Spain and North America. Tweed will be sent to Cuba, and from there to New York. The Epoca states, that the municipal authorities of New York took the initiation in asking for Tweed's extradition from Capt Gen Joveller.

PENNSYLVANIA.

PHILADELHHIA, Sept 11 .- A meeting of prominent citizens was had in the Mayor's office to-day to take measures to aid the sufferers from yellow fever in Sayannah. An executive committee was appointed to carry out the object of the meeting. Over a thousand dollars has already been subscribed.

SOUTH CAROLINA.

Report of the Charleston Exchange on the Condition of the Growing Cotten Crop.

CHARLESTON, S. C .- The Report of the Charleston Exchange on the condition of the cotton crop for August compiled from 86 replies, covering 29 counties, is as follows:

Weather :- Seventeen refer to the weather during the month of August, as favorable. Twenty-four report the first half of the weather showery, afterwards hot and dry. Twenty-two report hot and dry. Twenty report changeable, compared with last year. Twentyfour report the weather more favorable than for the same month last year. Twenty report equally favorable. Seventeen report as less favorable. Fortytwo report the crop to be well fruited. Fourteen report the crop as fair in this respect. Twenty-three report the crop

as not well fruited. From all sections there are reports of shedding of fruits, and in light sandy soils it is shedding heavily. The crope in the upper portions of the State is good, and much better than last year's. In Eastern and Southern sections, it is very much injured by rust and drought, and its condition is about the same as last year. Picking has not commenced in the upper counties. In the middle counties, picking has begun. In the lower counties, where the rust is doing much injury, it is general. In the upper part of the State, it will become

last year,s, but the prevailing hot weather, and the rust, which is reported in fifteen counties, are forcing it open rapidly, and to a large extent before the bolls are fully matured.
