

Report of the Cotton Crop.

WASHINGTON, Sept 14.-The September returns to the Department of Agriculture, as was expected, show a decline for the remarkably high figures of July, in all the cotton States except Louisiana. In some of the more South ern counties of the cotton belt, the catterplilar has been more or less destructive, while in a few lacalities of the extreme Southwest, the boll worm was somewhat troublesome. The conditions of the growth during August were quite varied. In some cases protracted drought with extrme heat injured the crop, while in others complaints of excessive rain were rife. Yet the aggregate reduction is below what ought to have been expected from the extent of local disasters reported.
