FOREIGN. Chinese Repatriation. More About the Boss—Schooner Lost. LONDON, Sept. 26.—A dispatch to the Times from Shanghai reports arrangements have been effected on the Yunnan outrage, the terms unknown, except that compensation to Margary's family was agreed upon. Chicago, a city on the Yangtze river, 120 miles above Chungking and three other ports are now opened to foreign commerce. The convention will be signed shortly. MADRID, Sept. 26.—The Franklin will take Tripod and Hunt off this week. Nothing is known about Sharky. Queen Isabella remains at the Palace of the Escorial until October. HALIFAX, Sept. 26.—The schooner Blooming Bill, is totally wrecked. The schooner Three Brothers is burned to the water's edge. MASSACHUSETTS. A Physician Fatally Injured by an Insane Patient. BOSTON, Sept. 26.—Dr. Chas W Woodbury, assistant surgeon at the McLean Insane Asylum, was beaten probably fatally, over the head by a patient, while playing croquet. The weapon was a croquet mallet. The 9th annual meeting of the American Academy of Dental Science was held yesterday. Dr D M Parker was re-elected president and Dr E Y Tucker, vice-president; Dr Geo T Maffatt corresponding secretary, and Dr M L Tacker, treasurer. MARYLAND. Survivors from the Wreck of the Rebecca Clyde. BALTIMORE, Sept. 26.—Five of the six survivors of the crew of the steamship Rebecca Clyde, wrecked near Crocooke inlet, North Carolina, Sunday, Sept 17, have reached Baltimore; viz: Solomon Whitely, oiler, Wm English, seaman, John Buckley, and Robert McGinn, fireman, and Patrick Halpin, coal passer, all bruised and some crippled. Capt. Clinton Smith of the schooner Hattie L Fuller from Brunswick Ga., has died of yellow fever at the quarantine station. The rest of the crew are well.

NEW YORK. Steamship Disaster. NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—A Levee's Delaware dispatch, says: The steamer Liberty from Havana, September 14, for New York, was abandoned at sea in a sinking condition during the hurricane on the 17th inst., in latitude 33 North, longitude 75. West. The crew were all taken off by the schooner Yellow Line, and landed at Lews. She had no passengers. MINNESOTA. Names of the Killed and Captured Bank Robbers. ST. PAUL, Sept. 26.—The dead Northfield bank robbers are Charlie Pitts, Bill Chadwick and Clem Miller. The prisoners are Calve Younger, Bob Younger and Al Custer. The last is a noted Texas desperado.

C., Sept. 26.—For the South Atlantic States, cooler, northwest winds, rising barometer and partly cloudy weather will prevail, followed by clear weather. WASHINGTON. Railroad Repaired—Rifle Teams. WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 26.—The damages caused by heavy rains along the Virginia Midland Railroad, have been repaired and trains are now running on schedule time. The teams were not full and count was kept only of individual scores. Fenton Irish made 43 out of possible 50. Roe Scotch made 44. Weber American 47. Slade Australian 45. These were best shots by respective teams at 800 yards.

JACKSONVILLE, Sept. 26.—There is not now nor has there been a case of yellow fever. The city is perfectly healthy. MONTGOMERY, Sept. 26.—Drs. Stone and Maudeville of New Orleans with ten nurses, passed through this city for Brunswick, Ga. PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 26.—Races of Breeders meeting was postponed on account of rain. SOUTH CAROLINA NEWS. The charade in Greenville for the aid of the Savannah sufferers realized \$2,750. The people of Central Station, Pickens, will have a grand barbecue sometime during the campaign, at which Messrs. Hill and Gordon will be invited to be present. The fever is still confined to the locality in which it first made its appearance; in the northeastern section of the city, and but four deaths have occurred. The Board of Health are very vigilant in their efforts at hygiene, and the streets have been sprinkled with carbolic acid.—Journal of Commerce, of 25th. The dedication of the new Catholic church in Greenville is to take place on Sunday, the 15th of October. The building is just approaching completion, and in its beauty and solidity surpasses the expectations of the people. At the ceremony of the dedication Bishop Lynch will most probably officiate, and Rev W F Clarke, the well known Jesuit preacher from Baltimore, is expected to be the orator. The ceremony promises to be a very imposing one. A correspondent of the News and Courier, writing from Columbia, under date of the 23d inst., says: "A week has elapsed since the first intimation of the outbreak at Ellenton was received in this city, and yet, strange to relate, nothing whatever of an official or definite nature has been received from the scene of the reported disturbance. The authorities at the Statehouse seem to be as much in the dark as are other people, and it is not even known by them how many persons have been killed and wounded." The annual report of the News on the trade of Greenville shows that during the past fiscal year the sales amounted to \$1,350,420, of which the 20,000 bales of cotton brought \$1,000,000. \$420,000 worth of groceries, \$240,000 of staple dry goods, \$127,000 of shoes, \$52,000 of clothing and \$65,000 of liquors were sold besides other articles. Eighteen hundred tons of fertilizers were sold at \$50 a ton. The prospect of the coming trade is very good, the factories offering high prices for cotton. Greenville and the wagon trade of Greenville, Pickens, Laurens, parts of Abbeville, Anderson, Oconee and Spartanburg, besides a considerable amount from North Carolina. The News wants a narrow gauge road to Brevard, N. C.
