

AN OCEAN CABLE IN THE PACIFIC:-The Asiatic Telegraph Company, chartered by the last Congress, propose to complete the last link in telegraphic communication around the world by laying a submarine cable in the Pacific ocean to communicate with Asiatic and American lines. The company is required to begin to lay the line within three years from August 15th last. The written acceptance of the terms of the act has been filed already with the secretary of State.
