

PLYMOUTH, Oct 20 .- Orders have been received at Devonport Dock Yard to complete repairs on the four turrett steamships, Cyclops, Hydron, Gorgon and Hecate, each carrying four guns; and on the iron clad steamer Aginicout, carrying 28 guns. Three composite gun vessels are building hereand two others in private yards, are being prepared for commission.

THE ELECTORAL VOTE.-Electors meet at their respective State capitols on the first Wednesday of December of the year in which they were elected, vote by ballot for President and Vice-President, and transmit a record of

their votes to the President of the United States Senate. A law of Congress provides that the electoral vote shall be counted by the two houses in joint session on the second Wednesday in February next succeeding the meeting of the electors of President and Vice-President. The question has arisen as to whether what has been known as the twenty second joint rule of the two houses is now in force. It provides that the houses shall assemble in the hall of the House of Representatives at 1 P. M., vote objected to by either house to be counted. In case of a disagreement the Senate retires, and both bodies deliberate on the admission of rejection of the vote of any State.
