

NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, Nov 13 .- Dispatches

received by the National Democratic Committee last night from New Orleans, say the situation is unchanged. The Herald still gives Hayes 166 electoral votes, and Tilden 184, with 19 doubtful. It says referring to doubtful States, so far as additional detailed returns go, they point as before to Bemocratic success. The Herald's New Orleans' special of the 12th, says United States Marshal Pilkin, telegraphed Gen Sherman to night, asking his presence here, and thinks he will come. The Times says its dispatches from Florida, Louisiana and South Carolina, confirm previous reports, that they have been carried by republicans. The Times' Washington dispatch says Sherman had a long interview with the President Sunday night, under orders to take command at New Orleans, and make such disposition of troops as will sequre public peace in any emrgency. The Times quotes Secretary Cameron: "The action of the President in the premises has been taken to insure a fair return and to furnish the people of the country with satisfactory evidence that the verdict of Tuesday, whatever it may be declared, has been free from frauds."

If this be refused the Prefect will forcibly enter the Vatican accompanied by Questor and also by Physicians, notaries and witnesses who after viewing the body will send a certificate of inquest to Cardinal Devean.
