TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Noon Dispatches. FOREIGN.

Peace Prospects Brightening—Terrible Loss of Life by a Cyclone. LONDON, Nov. 20.—Careful official contradictions are published this morning of the recent reports of activity at the Woolwich arsenal, where, the Post of Saturday stated, an order had been received for forty million cartridges, and forty thousand ammunition boxes in which to pack cartridges is a likely consequence of the adoption of the Martini-Henry rifle in the Indian army.

Official returns at Calcutta gave the loss of life by the recent cyclone as 215,000. The Calcutta Pioneer says the Indian government is preparing a strong contingent for Egypt in case of war. The Daily News' Vienna correspondent says positively that neither Germany nor Austria would oppose Russia's entrance into Roumania. The Russian army now in process of mobilization as a quarter of a million. All ships of Russia in the Black Sea navigation company are impressed.

MADRID, Nov. 20.—The Imparcial says Marshal Serrano has determined to retire into private life. The Sunday papers generally take a more hopeful view of the situation. The Times says: This morning's view opens so fairly, that we are perhaps led to be too sanguine in holding that peace is assured. It is hard to believe that when ten persons all representing powers deeply interested in keeping peace meet in council they will not maintain peace unbroken.

WASHINGTON.

Troops Arriving and More Expected—They will Probably Police the District Until After the Presidential Inauguration.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—Several companies of soldiers have arrived here and others are coming. This is made the basis for sensational paragraphs, about massing the army in this district. There are assurances that these troops are merely enroute, and their movements have no strategic or political significance. It is likely however that the district has no local government, that the army will police the 10 miles square until after the fourth of March.

NEW YORK.

Pinchback Claims His Seat in the Senate—If the Returning is a Legal Body, He is Justly Senator.

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—The Times' New Orleans dispatch says: It will be remembered that the returning board was created by the same legislature that elected Pinchback to the United States Senate. He was refused his seat on the ground that the Legislature was not properly and legally organized. Now he claims that as the returning board is recognized as a legal body, he should be seated.

WEATHER PROBABILITIES.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 20. For the South Atlantic States, cooler westerly, backing to warmer southwest winds, stationary or higher pressure and clear weather will prevail.

FOREIGN.

LONDON, Nov. 20.—The Marquis of Salisbury, special Ambassador to act at the coming conference, has been sent to Constantinople with his family. He stops at Paris, Berlin and Vienna personally, for consultation with the respective foreign minister.

The Pall Mall Gazette publishes a letter from Rothschild's completely denying the story published in the Cologne Gazette, Saturday, that they have promised to advance Russia money. The mail steamer Windsor Castle, plying between Great Britain and Cape Good Hope has been lost; the crew and passengers were saved. The British gunboat Lapwing is reported lost in a gale off Chafau.

WASHINGTON.

The Movement of Troops.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 20.—The commission of Wenden O'Neil, as Marshal for Kentucky was signed to-day. The movement of troops so far as regards their concentration here, has no political significance. Three members of the Cabinet, including the Secretary of War, had no knowledge that they were coming.

NEW YORK.

Gale Off Sandy Hook.

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—An easterly storm has prevailed here since Saturday night. Considerable damage has been done in this city. The weather is reported very rough outside Sandy Hook.

LOUISIANA.

Proceedings of the Board.

NEW ORLEANS, Nov. 20.—Three tables in the circle in the Senate Chamber; one for the returning board, and one for each committee. Corridors barricaded, guarded by assistant-Sergeant-at-Arms. Committees entered at noon. The republicans are Tuttle, Garfield, Sherman, Hale and Stoughton. Democrats as before reported. Each committee has a photographer to report proceedings. The committees to be present during executive sessions of board. Sessions daily from 10 to 4 o'clock.

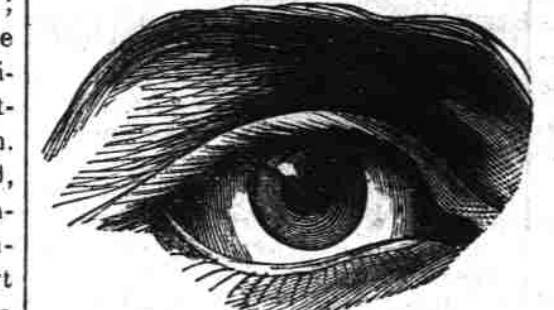
