SOUTH CAROLINA.

Democrats Encouraged About the Situation—Fish and Other Sane Men Remonstrate With the Conspirators—Hampton Tells the Emperor That Bayonets are Not Needed—The Republicans Becoming Disgusted and Joining the Democrats—The Military Not to Interfere.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—Democrats this morning consider the situation more encouraging. It seems certain that South Carolina will be allowed to solve her domestic problem without further interference from the military, than may be necessary to preserve the peace.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—In the caucus Randall beat Cox ten votes for speaker. Only two candidates.

Mid-Night Dispatches.

WASHINGTON.

Mr. Fish on the Policy of Non Interference of the Troops in South Carolina.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—The Times Washington dispatch says: "Speaking of the cabinet meeting yesterday, says it is known sufficiently well that some of the cabinet were in favor of the rejection of the Democratic mass meeting from the Legislative hall in Columbia, by the United States, of military power."

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—In the caucus Randall beat Cox ten votes for speaker. Only two candidates.

SOUTH CAROLINA.

The Situation Unchanged in Columbia.

COLUMBIA, Dec. 2.—The situation is perceptibly unchanged. The Democratic and Republican legislatures have occupied the House of Representatives since Nov 30. Both are working to secure advantage.

LATER.

The two most prominent Republican members, both colored, Myers and Hamilton, of Beaufort, have just deserted Mackey's side of the House and have been sworn in by the Democratic Speaker Wallace; others are expected this evening.

ANOTHER DISPATCH.

COLUMBIA, Dec. 2.—A motion was made to-day in the Supreme Court in behalf of Wallace, Speaker of the Democratic House for mandamus on Mackey Speaker of the Republican House, to compel him to deliver the returns for Governor, in Mackey's possession to Wallace as the legal Speaker of the House.

FOREIGN.

A Specimen of French Legislation.

VERSAILLES, Dec. 2.—The Government today formally gave notice in the Chamber of Deputies of withdrawal of the bill on burials of members of that legion of honor. The House by 370 to 25 passed an order of day which was accepted by the Government, expressing confidence that in future the Government will, in regard to this matter respect the liberty of conscience and equality of all citizens.

SOUTH CAROLINA NEWS.

The dwelling of Mr. J. H. Durham, county treasurer, in Horry, was burned one night last week with most of its contents. The burning is supposed to have been accidental.

Numbers of competent men in Lancaster will accept the office of treasurer and auditor and transact all the business satisfactorily for \$1000 per annum. Saving thereby to the people \$3000 a year.

A dense cloud of witnesses, some three hundred in number, left Aiken last Saturday morning, on an extra train for Columbia, to testify before the United States Court, in the Ellenton riot and intimidation cases.

Henry Stewart and Jake Harris, the two colored men who were mainly instrumental in bringing about the arrest of Adam Johnson, were presented with twenty-five dollars each by the citizens of Aiken. They will also receive a part of the reward offered by the State for the capture of either of the murderers.

Farical Legislative Proceedings

SOUTH CAROLINA DEMOCRAT—TRUE AS STEEL.

Legal Steps to be Taken Before the Supreme Court on Monday.

THE DEMOCRATS LIKELY TO "HOLD THE FORT" IF THE TROOPS DON'T INTERFERE.

The Consider of the Old State House Resound with Camp-Meeting Songs by the Rump Members of the Legislature with Banjo Accompaniment.

[Special Dispatch to the Observer] COLUMBIA, S. C., Dec 2, 1876, 11.45 P. M.

The affairs at the Capitol, are about in the same condition, as they have been for the past two days. Both Houses are still in session, and are expected to remain all day Sunday.

The rule against Mackey, the bogus speaker, to show cause why he should not deliver the official returns to speaker Wallace, relating to the gubernatorial vote at the recent election which were placed in his hands, is returnable Monday.

The Senate transacted no business to-day. The Republicans seated their members from Abbeville, although the Democrats have certificates from Secretary of State, having passed the scrutiny of the canvassing board. This became necessary for a quorum.

The Democrats are more hopeful, and expect a peaceful solution of this problem, in a few days. It is believed here that Gen Ruger will not interfere, except to preserve the peace. No disturbance is anticipated. It has been discovered that some colored Republican, has been personating one of the bogus members (this seems to be a double bogus—Ed) from Barnwell county, which delegation was seated, although the Democratic members, from that county held certificates from the board of canvassers, and the Secretary of State. The seating of these two delegations has excited great disgust, and is regarded as the crowning act of folly, of this rump assembly.

Last night the negroes enlivened the all night session, by singing "Hold the Fort for Hayes," "Angelina," etc. accompanied by a banjo. They went through the same performance after seating the Abbeville delegation.—Preaching is anticipated to-morrow.
