

Foreign Complications.

BELGRADE, Jan. 2 .- The Servians ar jubilant over the prolongation of the Armistice. All warlike preparations have ceased. The militia en route for the front, have been recalled.

LONDON, San. 2.- A gale unprecedented in violence prevailed on the South coasts of England, yesterday. Dover pier was partially destroyed. Nearly every coast town from Dover to Portsmouth was partially inundated by the high tide.

A Pesth dispatch from Buchares reports that hundreds of Jewish fami lies were recently ordered by the Mayor of Baslin, in Maldovia, from that town within thirty days. Many perished from cold on the roadside.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Jan. 2.- The European plenipotentiaries held an informal meeting on Monday to consider the counter proposals. The Russian, German, Austrian and French delegates decided they could not act with FURNITURE, the Porte, and seemed inclined to cut short the discussion. After Lord Salis bury stated his views, they became calmer. Gen. Ignatieff, however, sent to the representatives a telegram from Prince Gortscakoff, directing him not Gov. 
