WASHINGTON.

The Situation in New Orleans Unchanged—No Vote in the House Without the Consent of the House—Orton Not Before the House Yet.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan 12.—A Gloucester, Massachusetts special dated Jan 11th, reports ten schooners of the fishing fleet from that port, missing; doubtless lost, and the crews probably perished.

In the Senate Mr. Chaffee of Colorado introduced a bill to abolish the use of stoves for heating railroad passenger cars; referred to the Committee on Railroads.

The Judiciary Committee of the House will report the answer of Barnes of New Orleans, the telegraph manager, as insufficient, and submit the case to the House for further action.

The Committee on Privileges and Elections had no meeting.

The latest dispatches from New Orleans show no change in the situation. The Republican Senate is still without a quorum.

A dispatch from Salem, Oregon, says a Republican lawyer got three thousand dollars for arguing in favor of Cronin, before Governor Grover; that Cronin got three thousand for carrying the vote to Washington.

The Rev. A. W. Petzer, pastor of the Central Presbyterian Church of this city has had the degree of Doctor of Divinity conferred upon him by the Arkansas College.

Lucille Western the actress, is dead. Age 34 years.

WATERTOWN, Jan 12.—The thermometer at 1 o'clock this morning indicated 20 degrees below zero, a change of 60 in ten hours.

Grand Duke Alexis Arrived.—NORFOLK, Jan 12.—The frigate Svetlana, flagship of the Russian squadron arrived in Hampton Roads this evening, having on board Grand Duke Alexis and Admiral Bontaff.

Fatal and Malicious Interference With a Railroad Track—Coroner's Inquest.

PENSACOLA, Jan 12.—The Coroner's inquest in the case of Butler, killed in the accident on the Pensacola Railroad returned a verdict of malicious interference with the tracks by parties unknown.

Another Ineffectual Ballot in the Bogus Legislature.

NEW ORLEANS, Jan 12.—The Republican Legislature had another ballot, resulting: Pinchback, 28; Antoine, 22; Bertie, 12; Lewis, 11. The remainder scattering.

St. LOUIS, Jan 12.—The Rev. Stuart Benson of Louisville, has recovered thirty thousand dollars and his lawyers fees and costs, in a libel suit against the Rev. J. B. McMillen.

WASHINGTON.

House Resolution that the President of the Senate Cannot Count the Vote—Memorial of the Business Men of New Jersey About the Situation—Frelinghuysen Speaks.

WASHINGTON, Jan 12.—HOUSE.—The House had at its bar to-day E. W. Barnes, the recalcitrant witness, and after listening to his answer that if he again assumed control of the New Orleans office and there were there any of the telegrams demanded of him, he would be willing to produce them.

Knights of Kentucky, from the Committee on determining the Rights and Privileges of the House in counting the electoral vote, submitted a report declaring that the President of the Senate has no right to determine what electoral votes shall be counted, and that the powers of the Senate and House are equal in respect to the counting of these votes.

Confirmation: Woodford Attorney of Southern District of New York.

SENATE.—Frelinghuysen presented a petition of persons representing the financial, commercial, manufacturing and business interests of Newark, N. J., asking that in counting the electoral vote all party considerations be laid aside and pure unselfish patriotism guide the action of Congress.

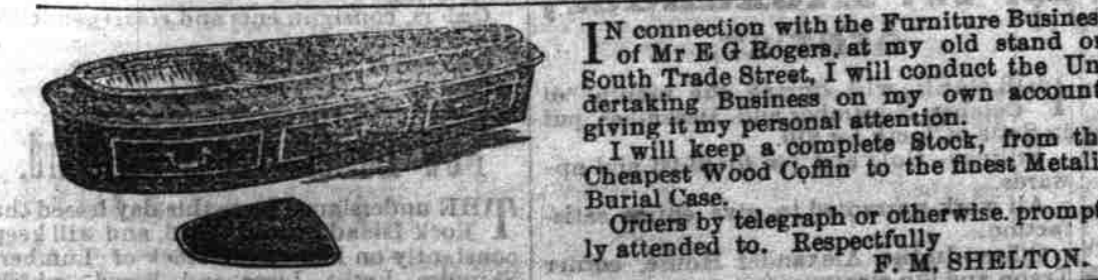
