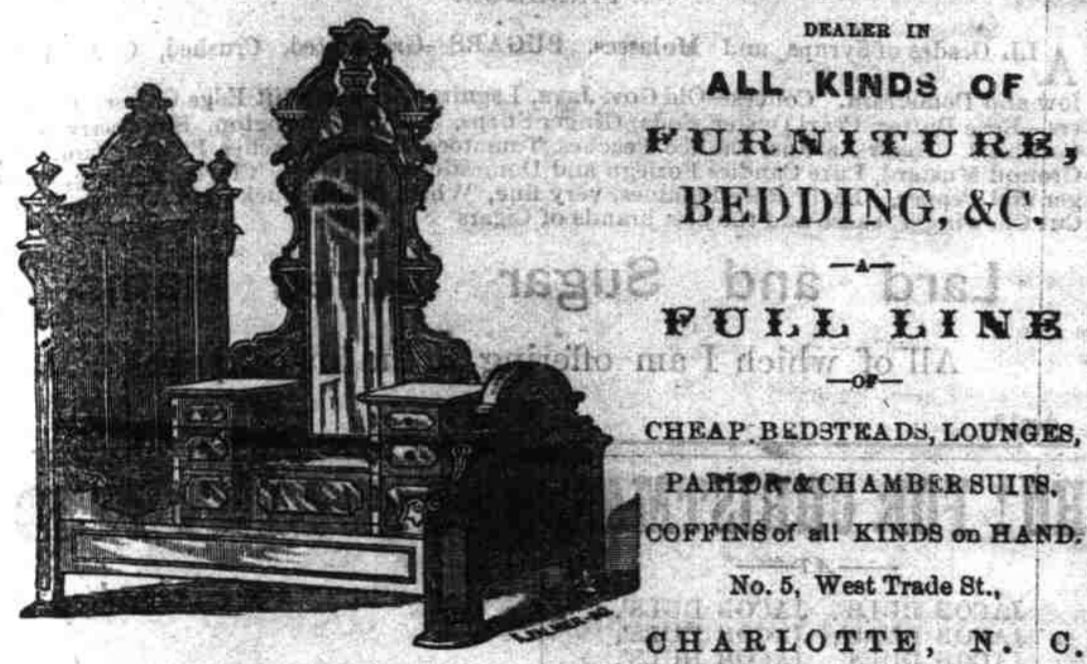

WASHINGTON.

The Louisiana Returning Board and Gov Packard Summamed to Appear at the Bar of the House.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan 16.—It is understood here that the President's order of Sunday to Gen Augur was simply intended to keep matters in New Orleans in statu quo.

The bill for the commissioners on the silver question was defeated.

Mr. Sherman of Ohio, interrupting the reading, said he would suggest that the paper be printed on the record without taking up time to have it read.

Mr. Sherman said when a Senator produced a petition he became the guarantor that it was proper and for that reason it need not be read.

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LOUISIANA.

Gov Nicholls' Letter to Pinchback Endorsed—Augur not to Interfere and Neither Claimant is Recognized.

NEW ORLEANS, Jan 16.—2 P M.—Sheriff Handy refuses to recognize the writ of habeas corpus issued by Judge Shaw for Assistant Sergeant at Arms of the Republican Senate who is in prison here.

The President has replied to Gen Augur that he (Augur) correctly understood his orders, in refusing troops to enforce Packard's proclamation.

A NEW YORKER RESENTS AN INSULT TO AN AMERICAN WOMAN—AN ITALIAN DUELIST DISCOMFITED.—A special to the Journal of Commerce, dated New York, Jan. 13th, says: News has been received in this city by friends of J H Claxton, a resident agent of a New York and Boston house in Italy, that he had fought a duel at Tivoli, near Rome, on the 13th of last month, his antagonist being Bernard Scupi, a portrait painter of considerable note in Rome.

Claxton retorted in gentlemanly language, and without losing his temper. At last Scupi made certain comments upon the average virtue of American women, which instantly enraged Claxton, who struck Scupi a violent blow, felling him to the floor and demanding an apology.
